ENON CEMETERY

This cemetery is located just south of Ansley, Custer County, Nebraska and is also know as the Amsberry or Algernon Cemetery. The former town of Algernon was located northeast from this cemetery. It is not located on any maps and is not accessible from the road. This list of tombstone inscriptions was done in the late 1960's. Some of the information has been taken from old cemetery records.

Amsberry, F. M. Mar 5, 1854 - Sep 12, 1914 (old, home-made stone, hard to read)

Amsberry, Floyd, Mar 5, 1854 - Nov 2, 1928 (small marker - no dates)

Amsberry, Francis E., Jan 18, 1824 - Aug 6, 1897 and his wife Lucy

Amsberry, Lucy (Beard), Jan 12, 1827 - Oct 15, 1915

Amsberry, Martha, Sep 18, 1850 - Nov 2, 1928 (no marker on grave)

Amsberry, Olive and Edward, died 11 days apart in 1904 (no marker) 2 small children of Frank and Myrtle (Williams) Amsberry

Brand, Jasper H., "Father" 1849 - 1932; with wife Lucy Brand

Brand, Lucy E., died May 15, 1908, aged 7 years, 2 months, 24 days, daughter of J. H. and M. A. Brand

Brand, Mary A., "Mother" 1862 - 1935,

Elison, (Lucy (Greenlee) Elison, widow of Howard Elison, was born May 14, 1878, died Oct. 12, 1962. She is buried in Broken Bow cemetery - by her daughter Fern's decision due to lack of upkeep on this cemetery)

Elison, ____, (very old, no dates nor name other than word Elison)

Elison, Calbert Clayton, Apr 28, 1910 - Jan 20, 1919

Elison, Howard, Mar 19, 1870 - Feb 4, 1944 and his son Calvert Clayton Elison,

Elison, O. O. (Oliver on small marker) 1870-1944

Frazey, Sarah (Amsberry), Dec 11, 1848 - Apr 27, 1917 (no marker)

Greenlee, Jacob N., Feb 12, 1853 - Apr 19, 1932; and his wife,

Greenlee, Rosetta Rose C(Amsberry) Dec 14, 1855 - Aug 23, 1937(Rosetta on a small marker)

Harman, Orville S., Nov 21, 1902 - Aug 21, 1904 "Gone, but not forgotten"

Harman, Roger, small son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Harman

Keller, Clarence, "baby boy", the son of Henry and Dora Keller

Williams, Mary M. Apr 26, 1951 - Nov 9, 1902 (large monument has cross with a woman in long robe clinging to cross and word "Love" above, word "Truth" to right side and word "Life" to left side of cross)

Williams, Mr. and Mrs. Williams, the parents of Myrtle Williams Amsberry who married Frank Amsberry
